The Spirit of Valley

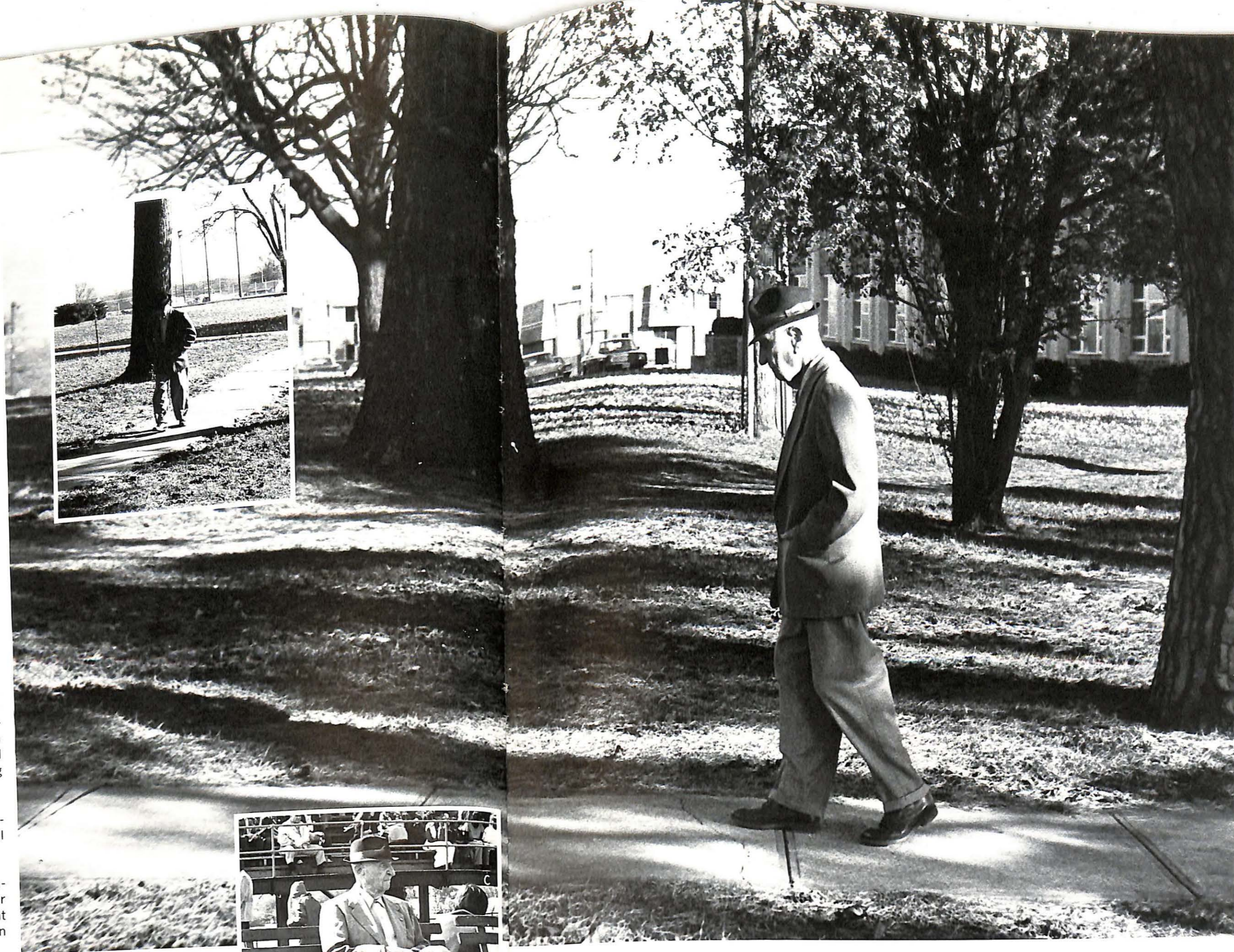

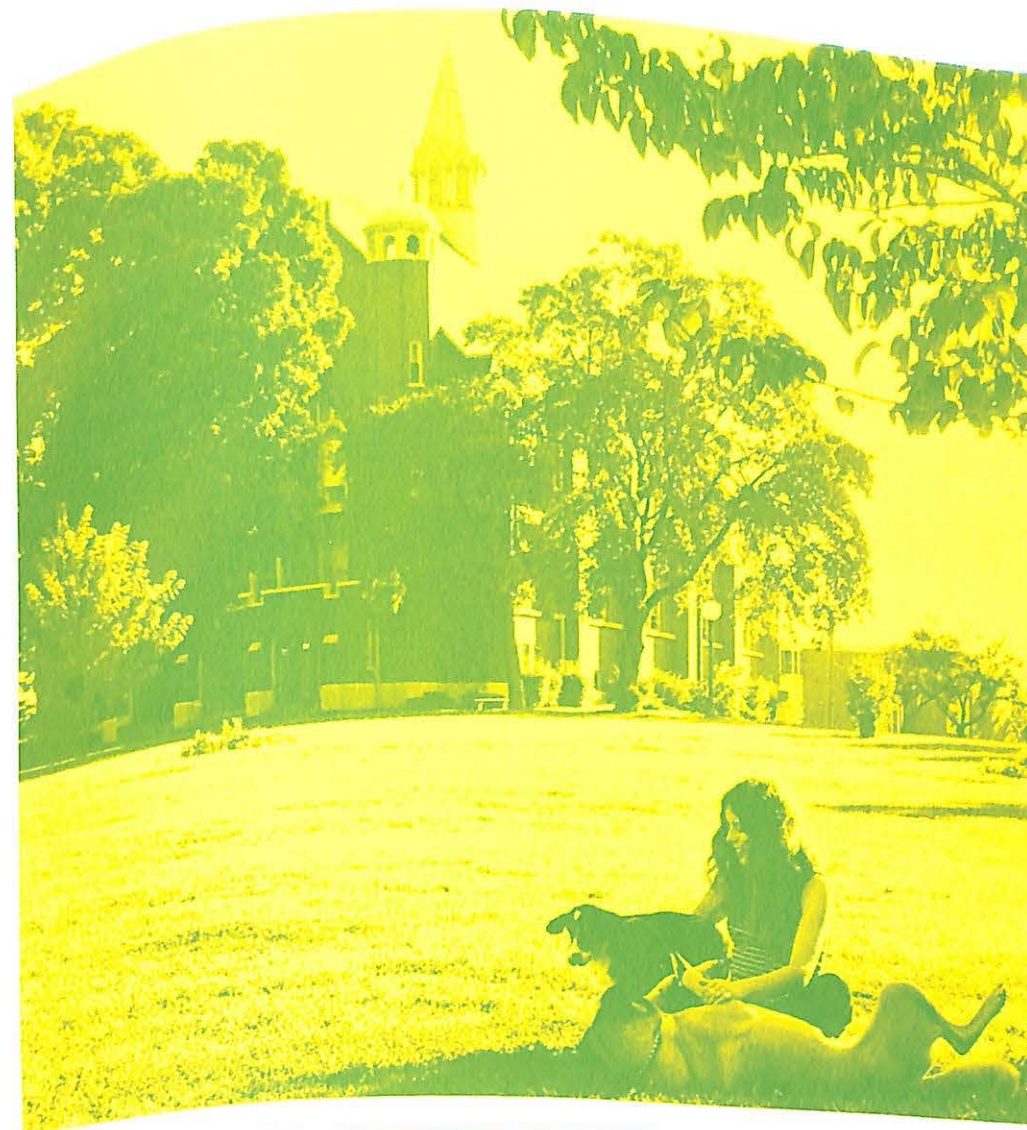

Valley as an institution has weathered difficult storms. This one will pass, and she will roll again.

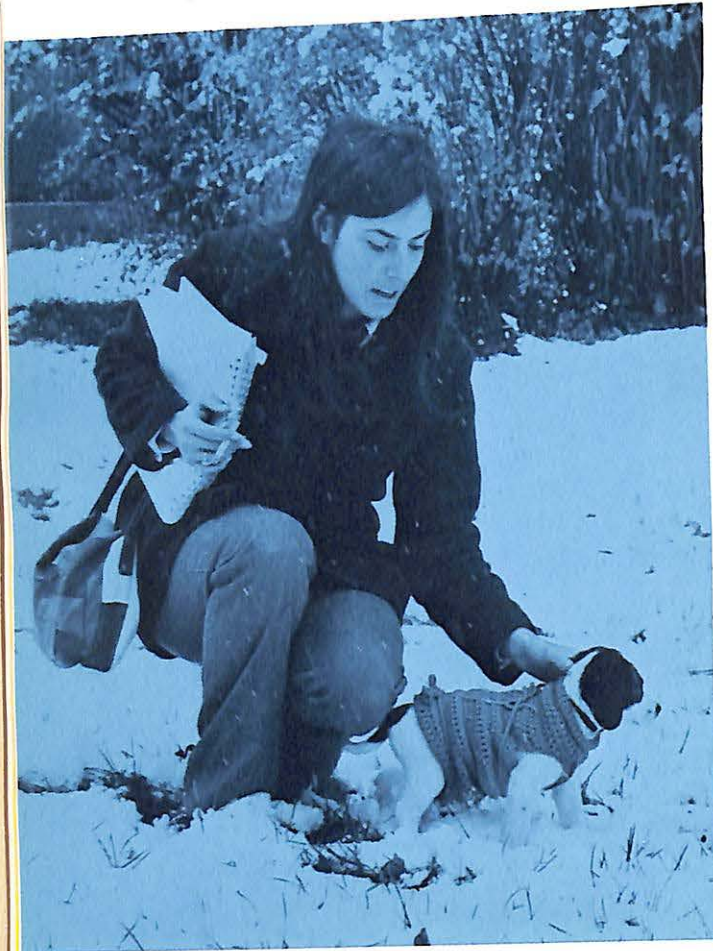
The buildings, the walks, the students are inspiring. When you hear the peck of a heel on the walk that person is going somewhere with an idea pointing to a goal.

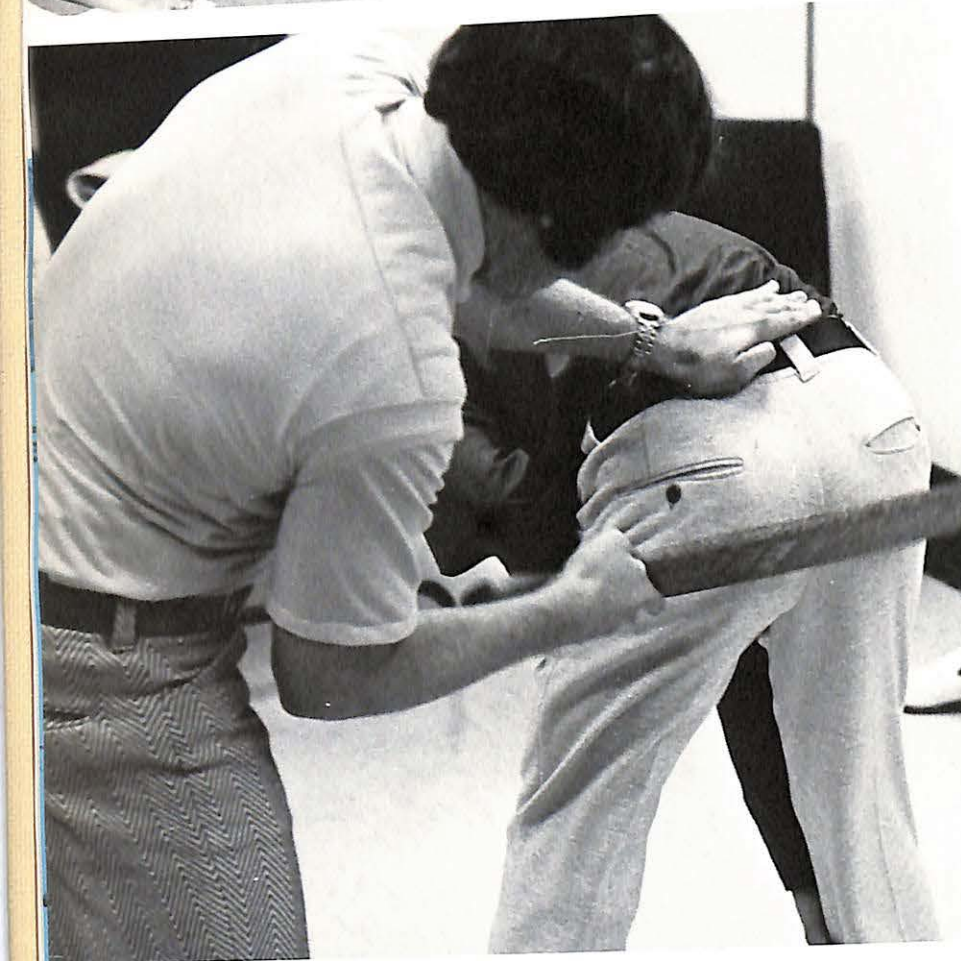
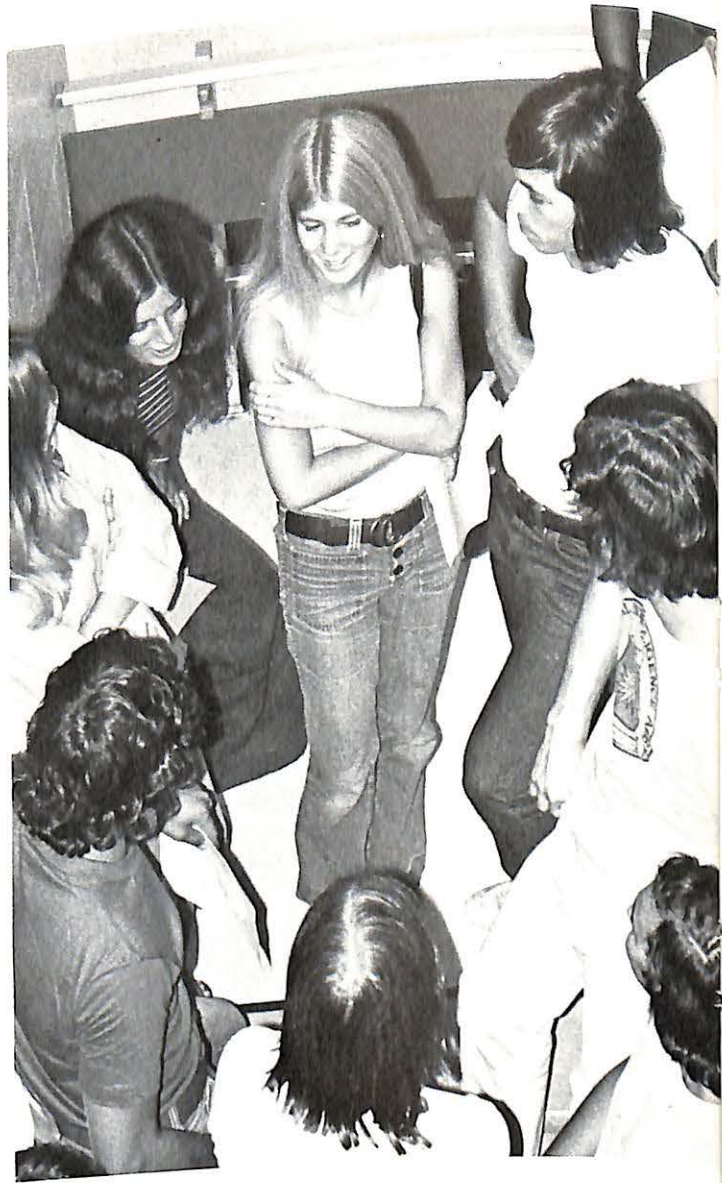

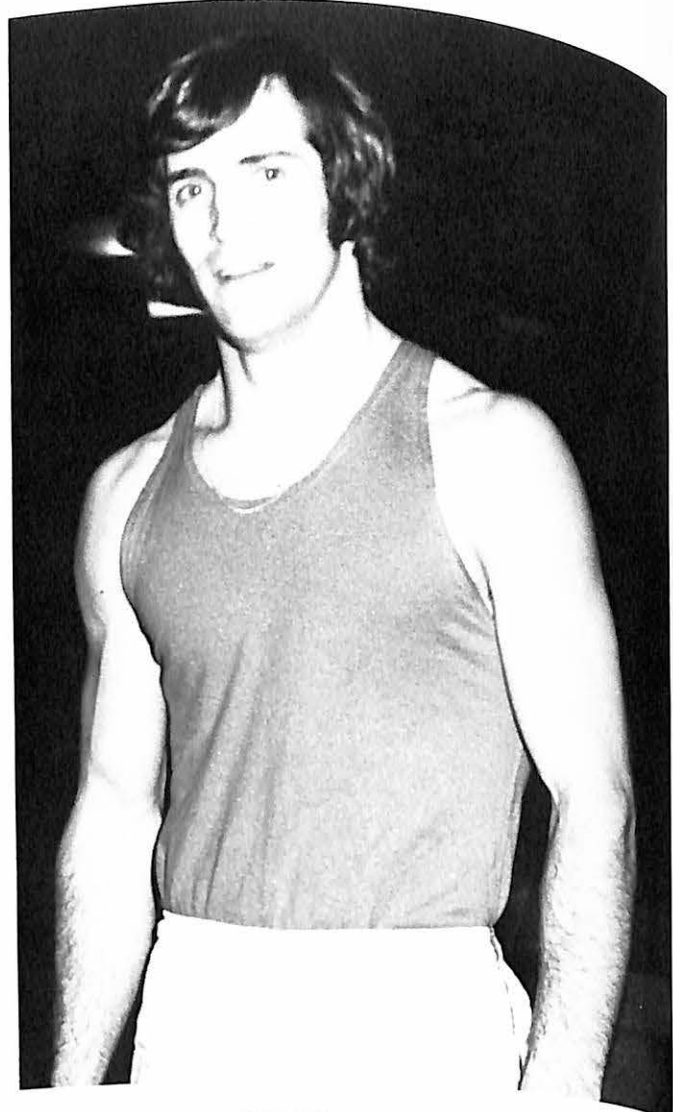
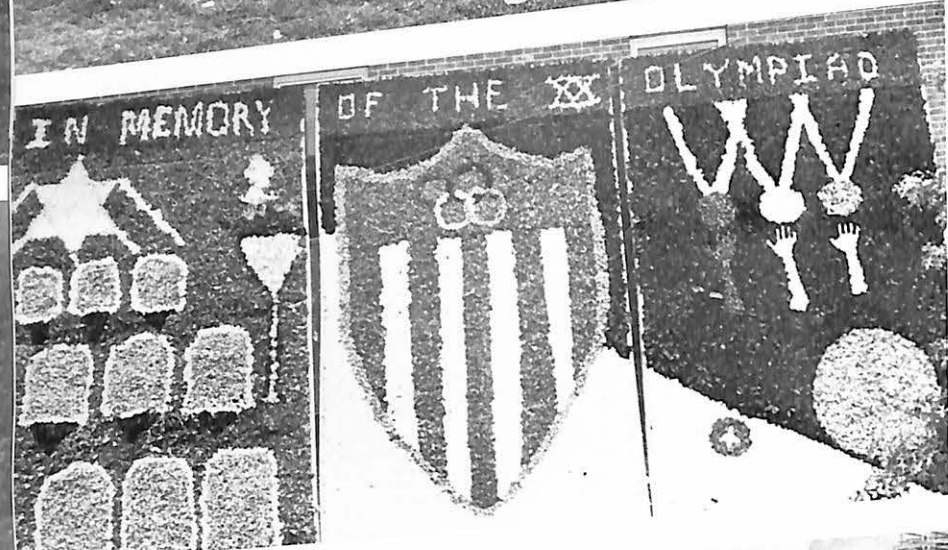




Alpha Sigma Phi

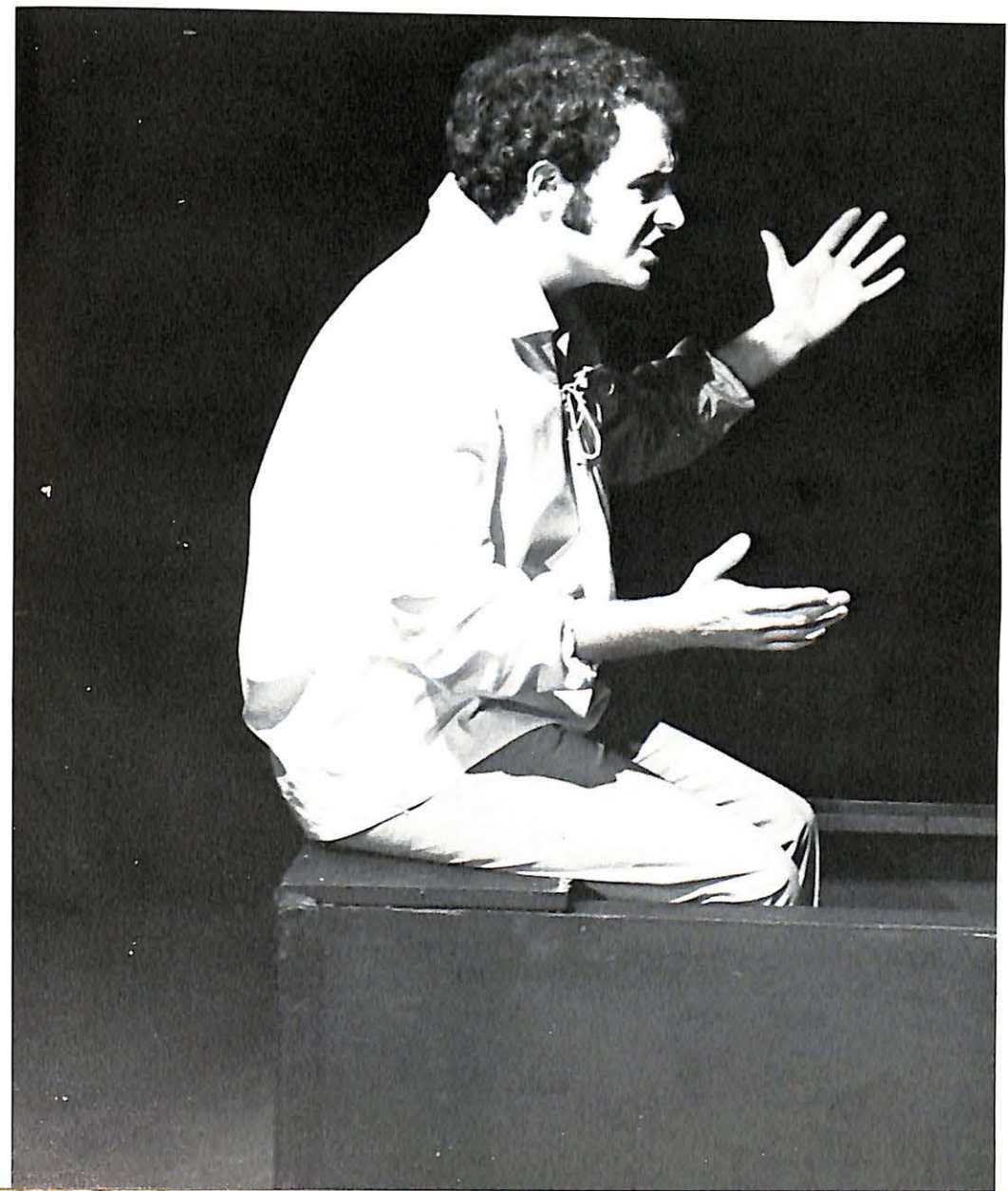
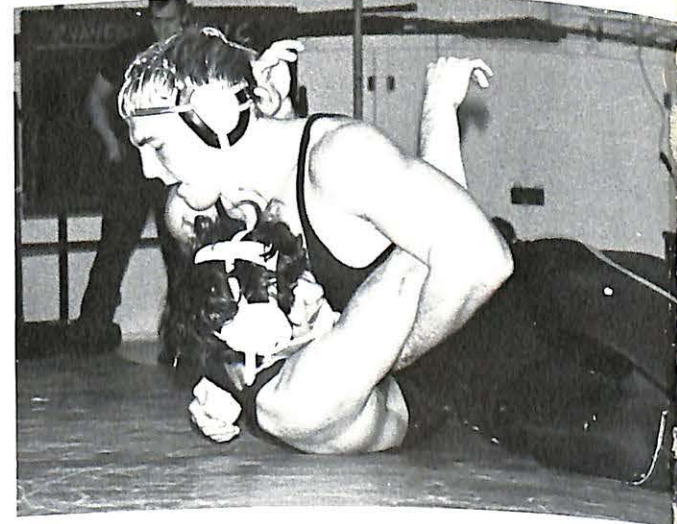


An End and a Beginning . . .
