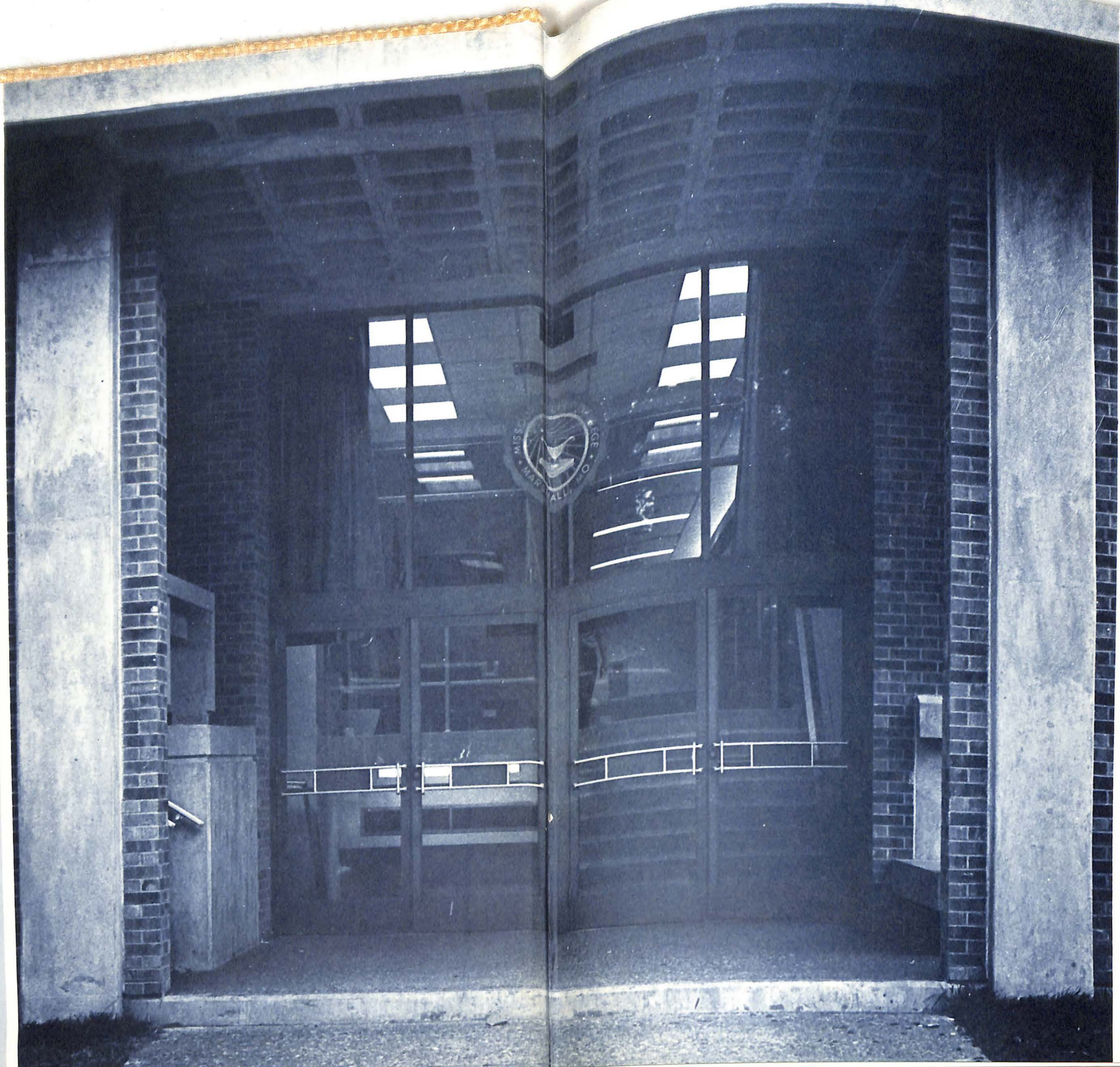

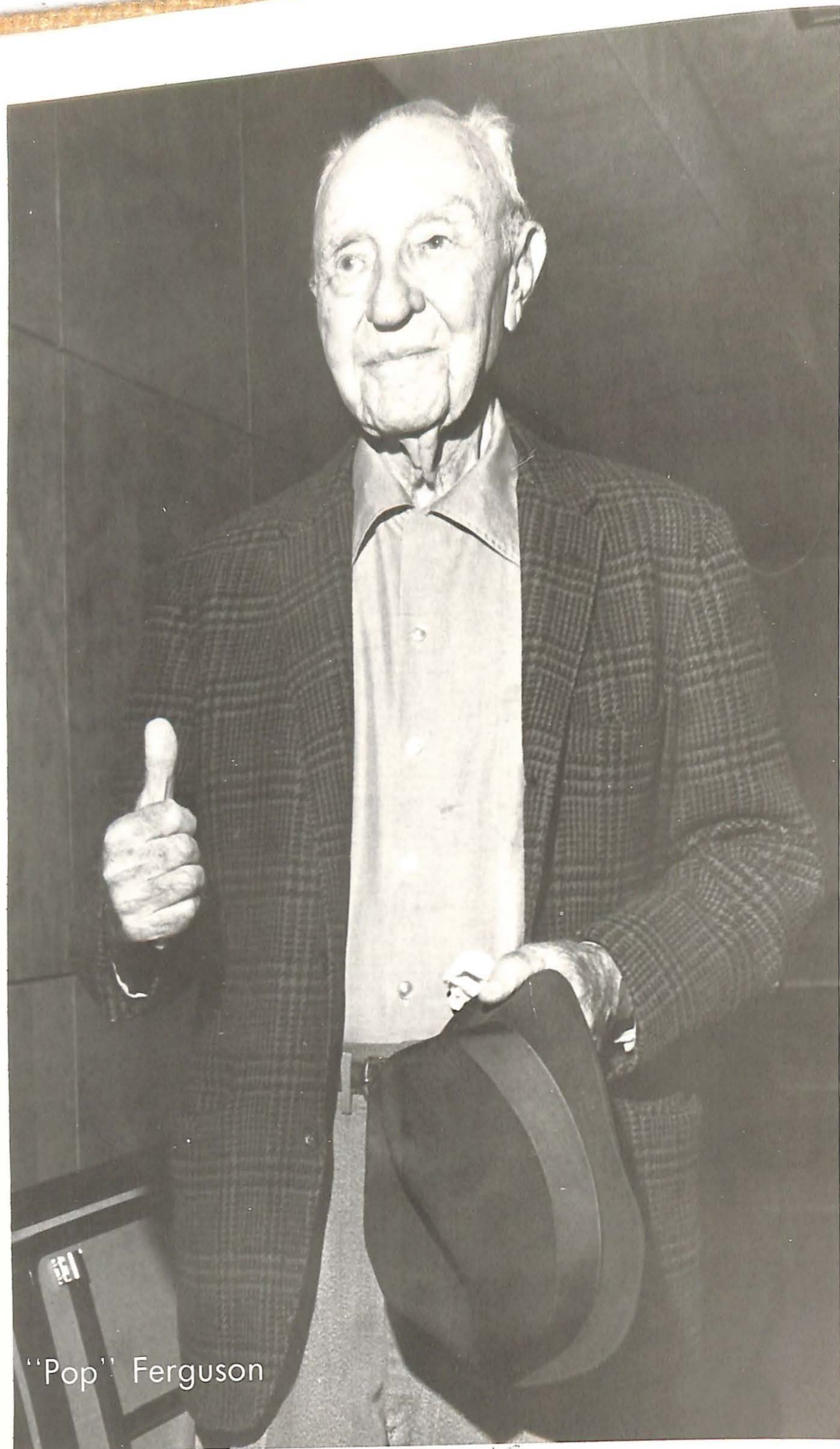

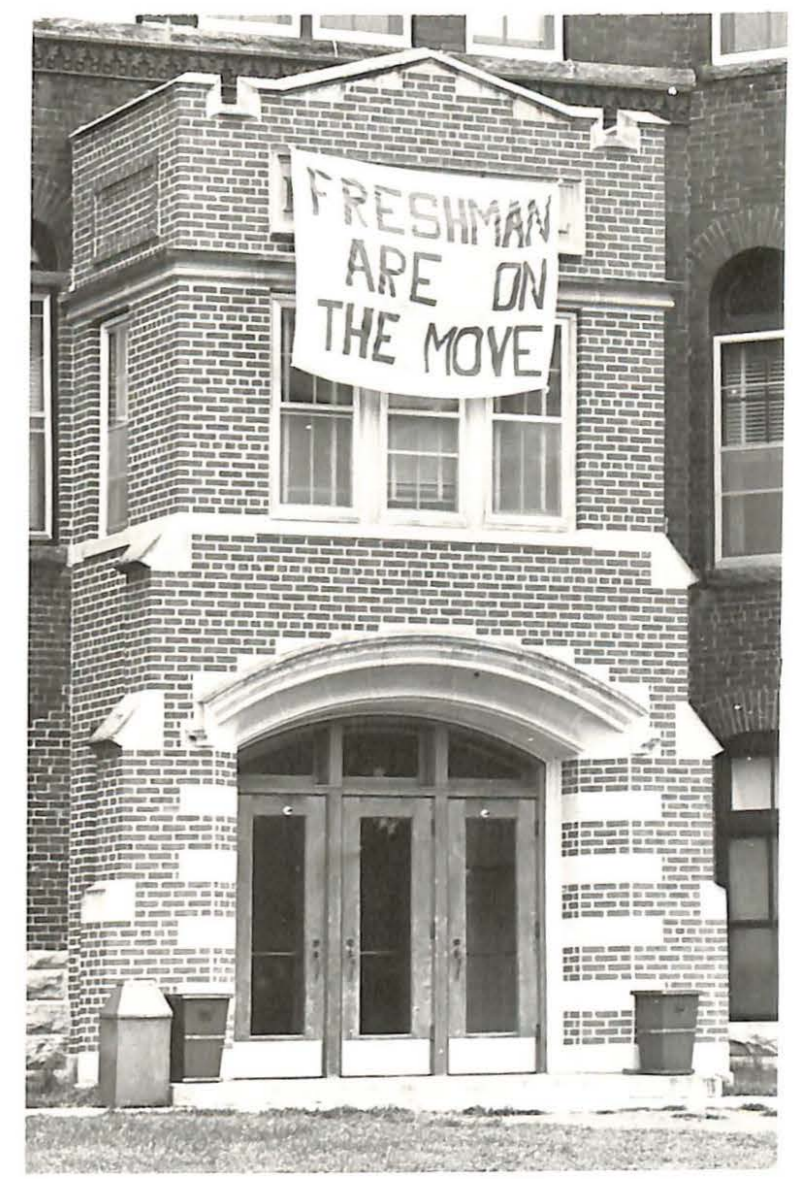

"... Real science is earthy; one of many branches of the human enterprise; one to be cultivated, but not a cult. Science must make more men its devotees, but none its priests... 1970 FOOTBALL SEASON

The 1970 Vikings opened their Football Season at home against the Eagles of Central Methodist. Directed by Head Coach Ken Gibler and with the return of fifteen starters at their positions, the team of Central Methodist was no match. The Vikings scored in every quarter behind the well-balanced attack of quarterback Lex Balazik. The offense accounted for 472 total yards, while the defense held their opponents to 183 yards, leaving the first score at Vikings 43 Central Methodist 16.

The following week Valley traveled to Emporia, Kansas to play the fighting "Presbies." An outstanding play by the offense and defense gave the Vikings victory. The Vikings scored first on a fine pass from quarterback Lex Balazik to split-end Danny Kratzer. The second score came on a run by Tony Chandler for 49 yards and the score. Sophomore tight-end, Larry Stowers, accounted for two other touchdowns, ending the game at 36-0 for a Viking victory. Valley's next opponents were the "Miners" of Rolla at Marshall. The game turned out to be a costly one, with an injury sustained to starting quarterback, Lex Balazik, which sidelined him for the next four games. The final score didn't seem to justify the struggle put up by the team. The passing of Rolla quarterback, Pat Goodwin, turned out to be the deciding factor, leaving the score at 21-7.

The Vikings next traveled to St. Joseph, Missouri to play Missouri Western "Griffons." Making up for the loss the week before, the Vikings went all out in defending the Westerns 47-17, with Dan Kratzer scoring five touchdowns.

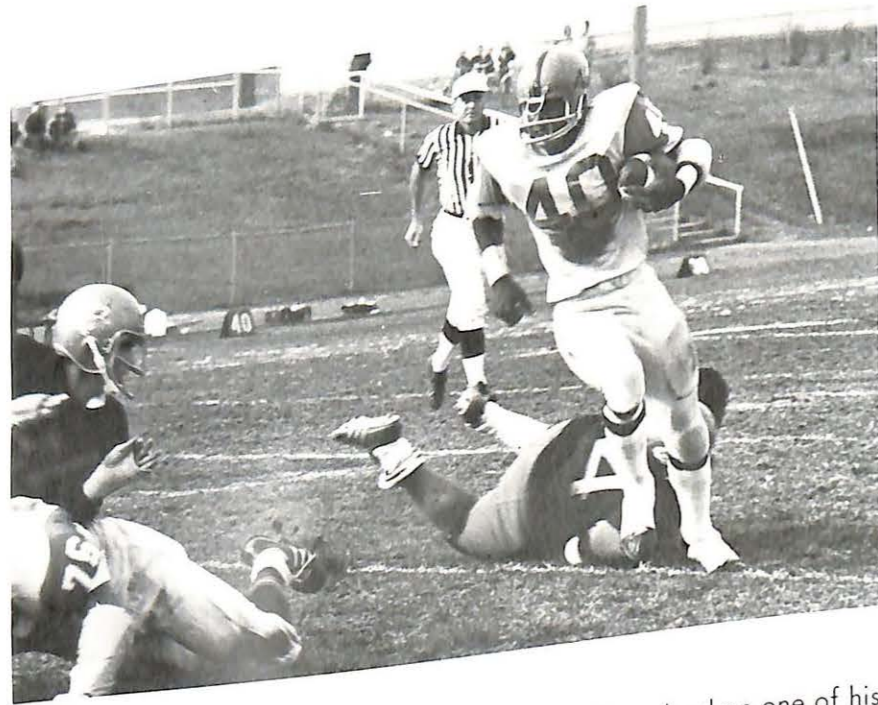
Valley's fourth victory came against Tarkio College. A strong defense which spearheaded three interceptions by Phil Willard, Dan Windt, and Stanley Jones, accounted for the Viking victory with a score of 17-3. Homecoming turned out to be a joyous occasion for the Vikings of Missouri Valley. Playing inspired football, the "Plainsmen" of Nebraska Wesleyan were still no match. Quarterback, Bruce Ayers, completed 7 passes of 7 attempts for a hundred and forty yards and three touchdowns enroute to a 38-19 Viking victory. Nose-guard, Kile Guthrey, won the Chittwood award as the most valuable player of the game.

Valley's seventh game of the season saw the Vikings go down to defeat. Lack of a potent offense and a come from behind effort by the "Ichobods" of Washburn proved to be too much. The final score was Washburn 23, Vikings 15.

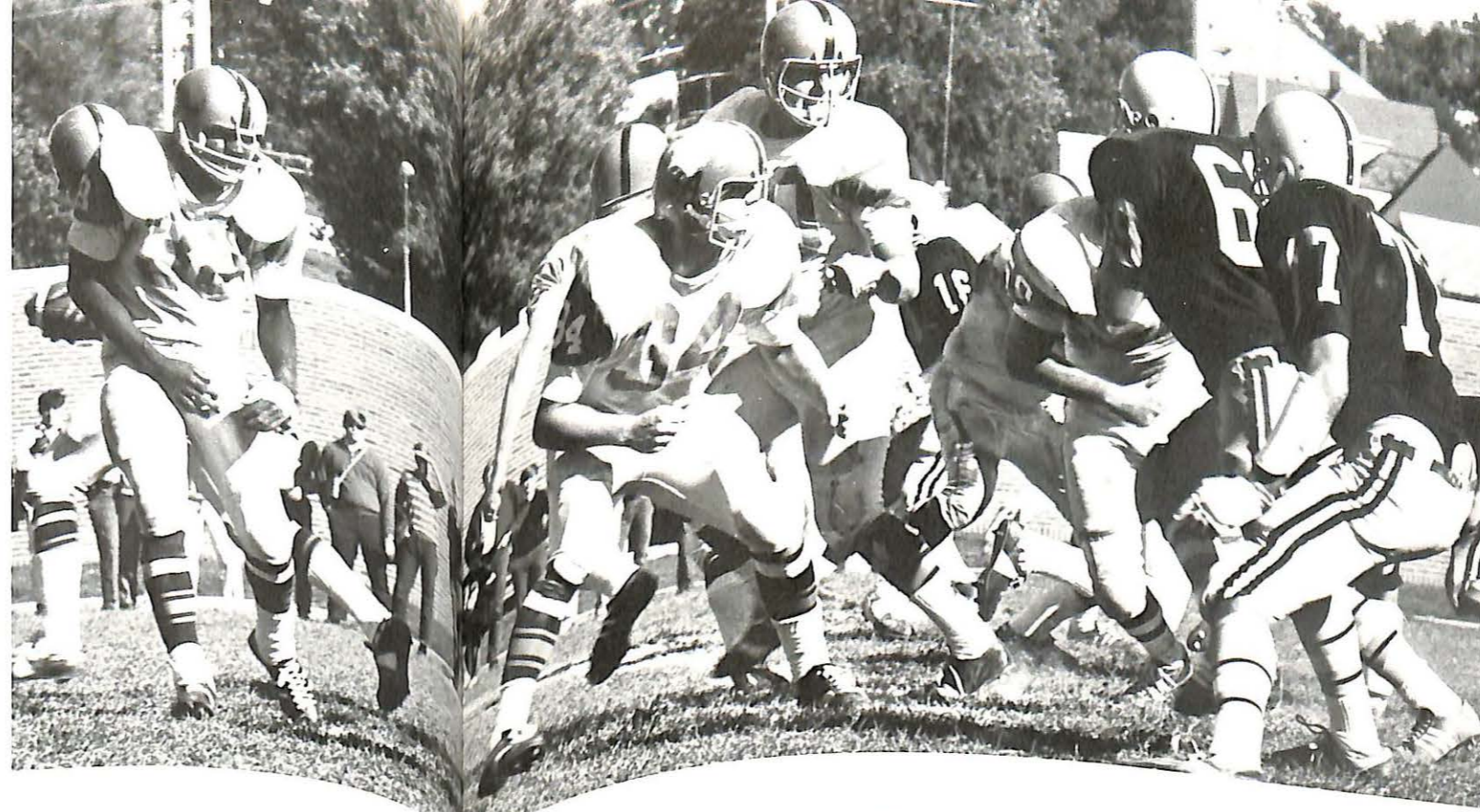
Led by defensive rover Mike Wojcik, the Vikings easily beat the "Lions" of Missouri Southern. The game saw a powerful offense and a stubborn defense insure the victory.

The final road game of the season was played at Lomoni, Iowa against the Graceland "Yellowjackets." Winning comfortably at halftime 21-9, the Vikings had to protect their lead to hold out for a 28-23 victory. The stage was set for the Vikings' last game of the season. With a 7-2 record and undefeated in conference play, they were host to William Jewel whom they hadn't beaten in the previous nine years. Behind the strong passing of quarterback, Bruce Ayers, and the fine passing of halfback, Tony Chandler, the Vikings were able to defeat the "Cardinals" 32-19. Victory meant 1970 Conference Champions; ranking 10th in the nation N.A.I.A., Division II. A small college; but 1970 was a brilliant season to look back on.

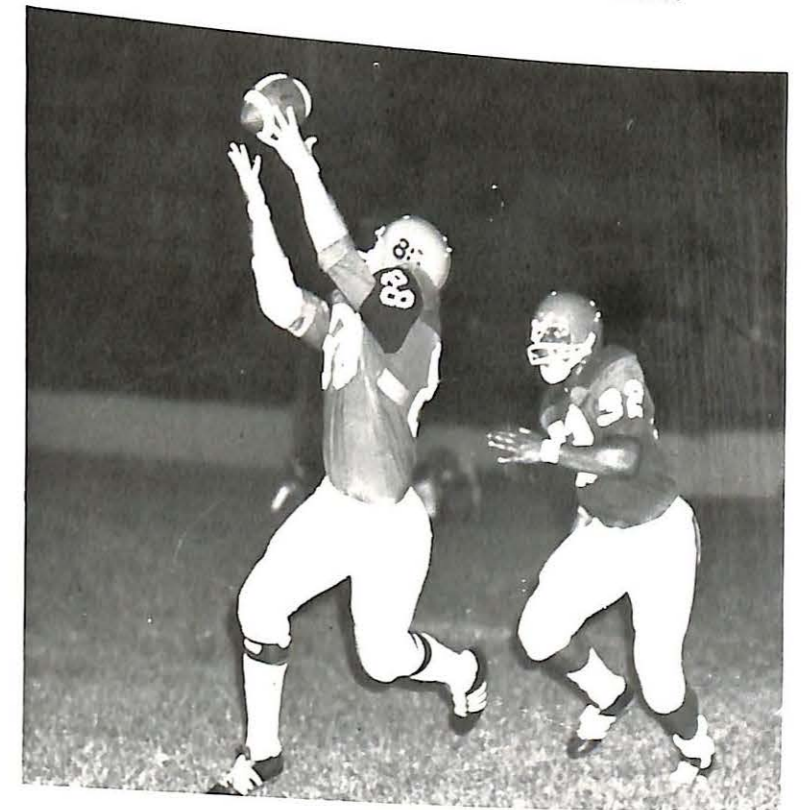

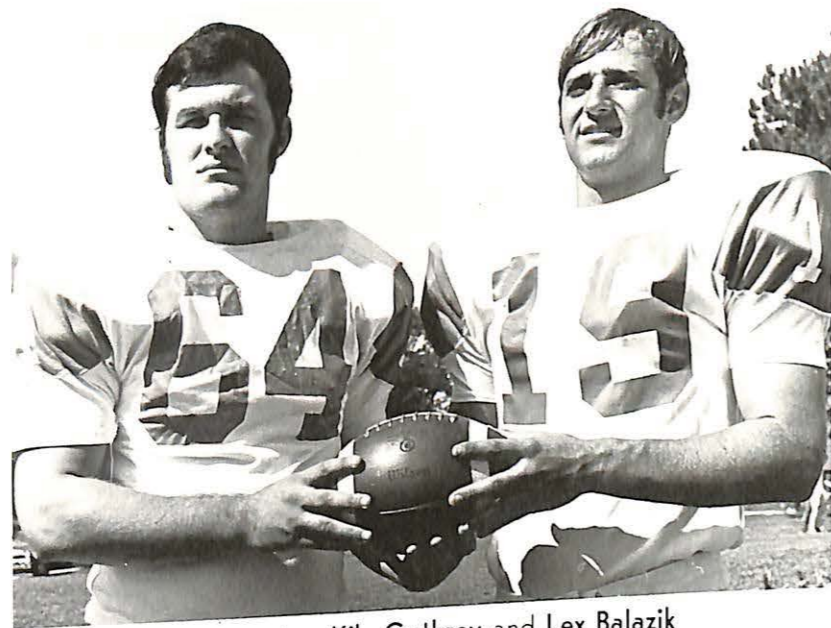

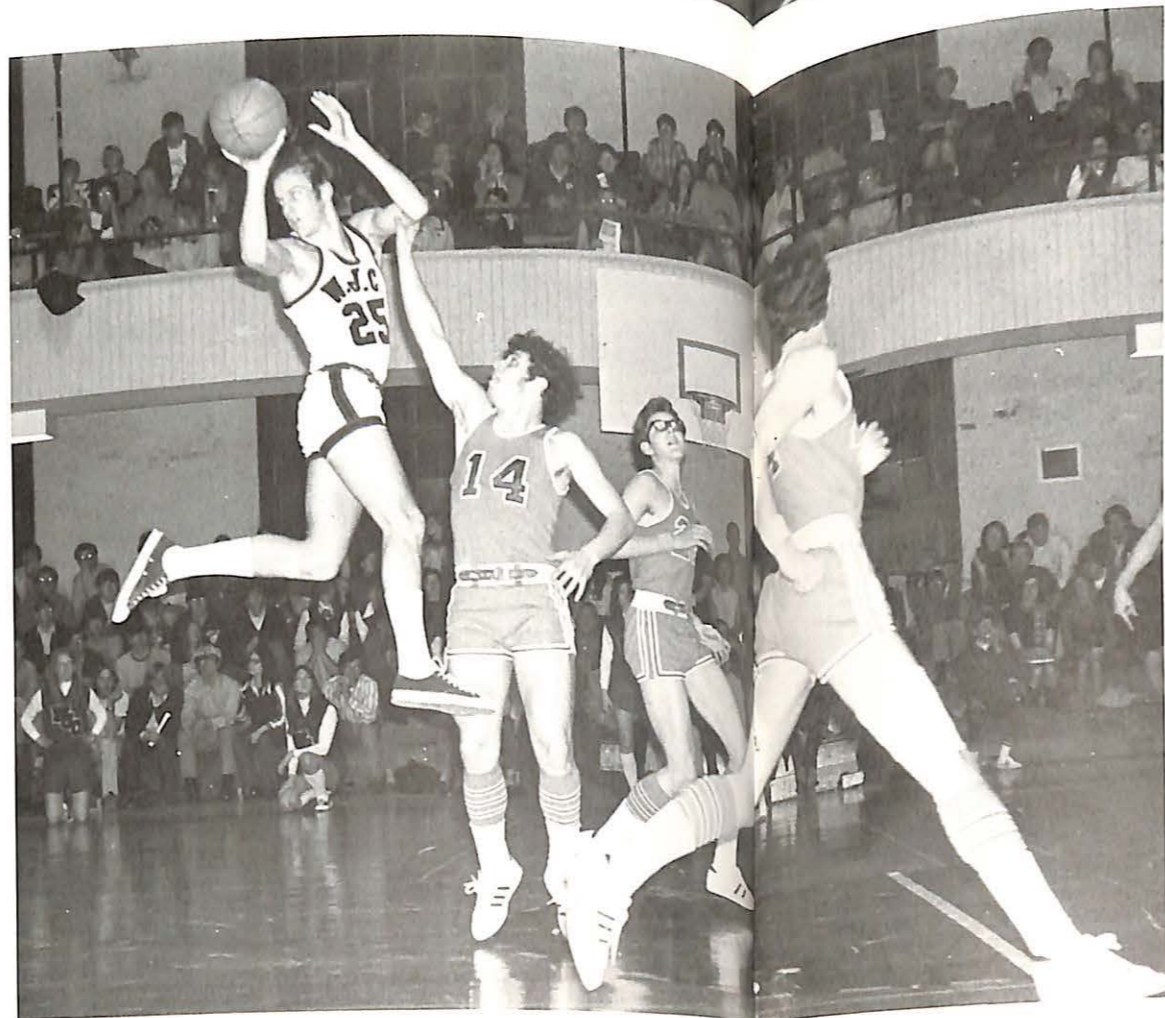

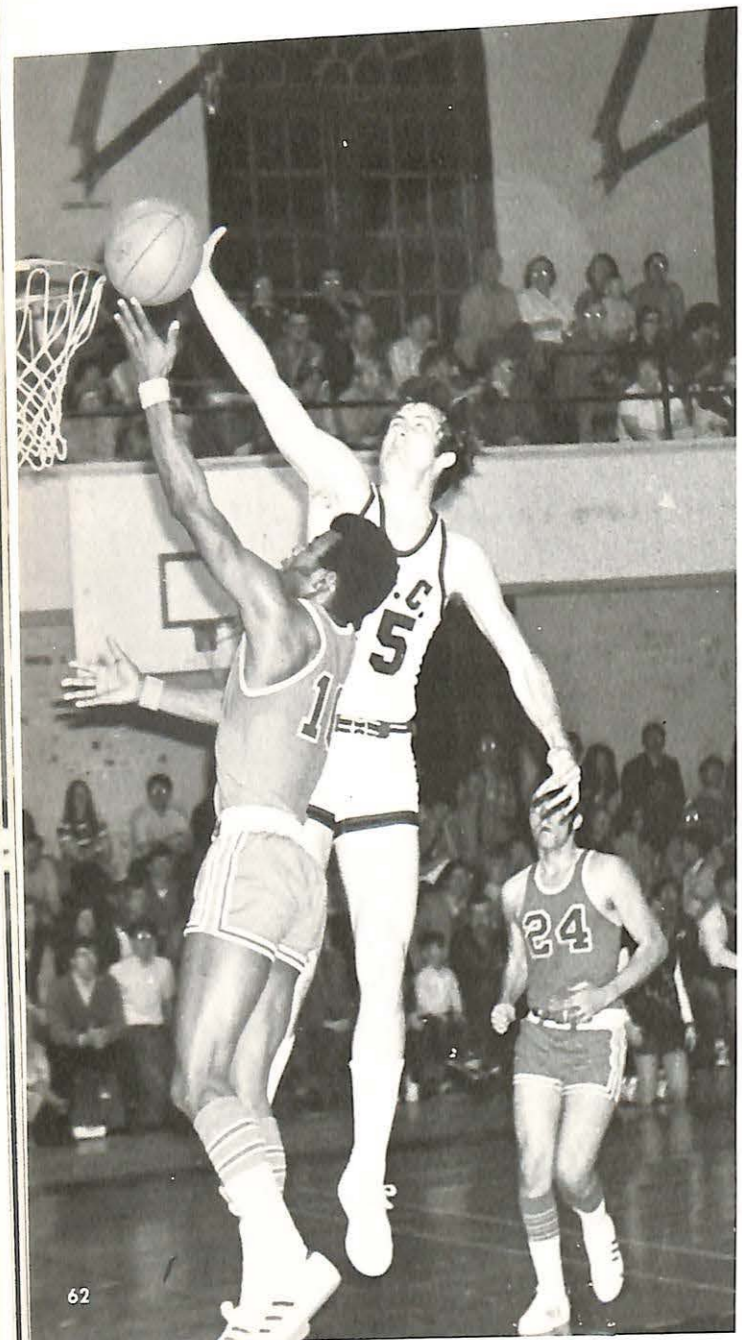

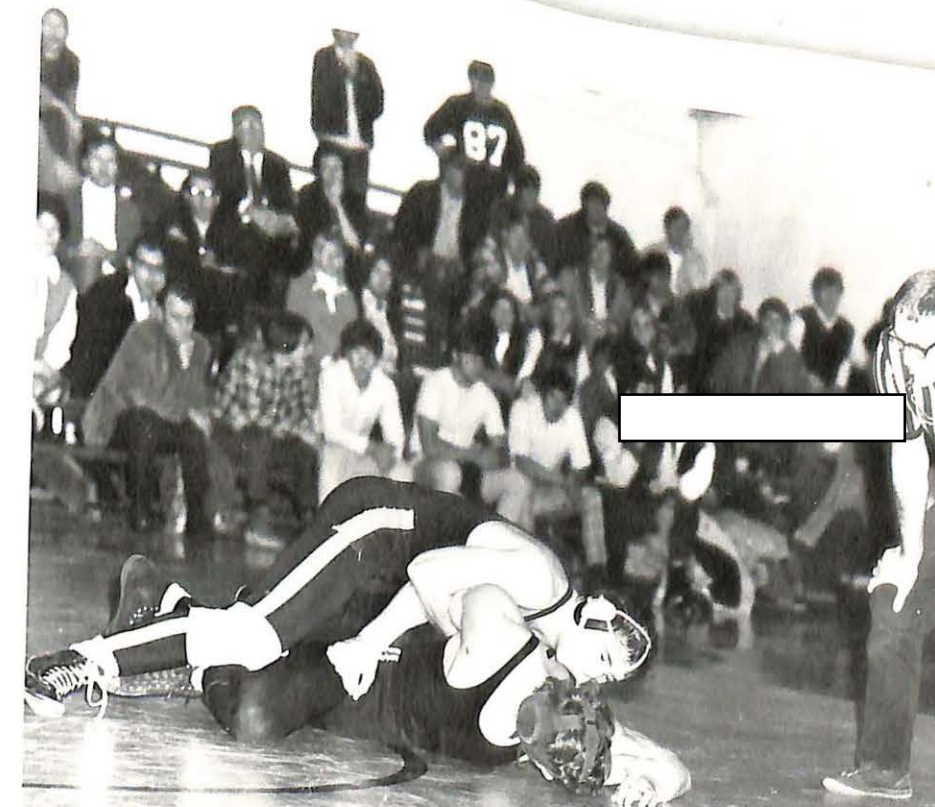

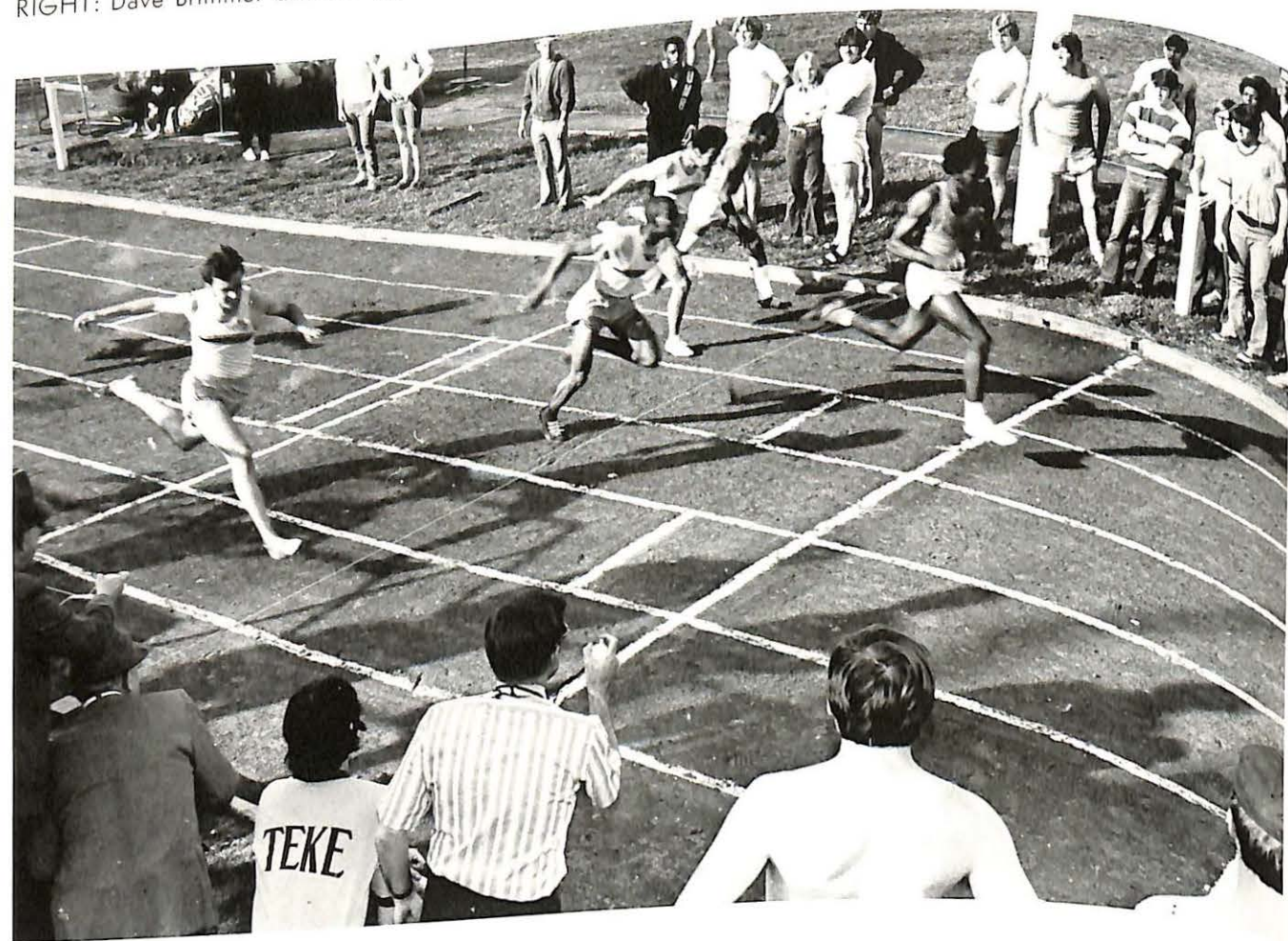

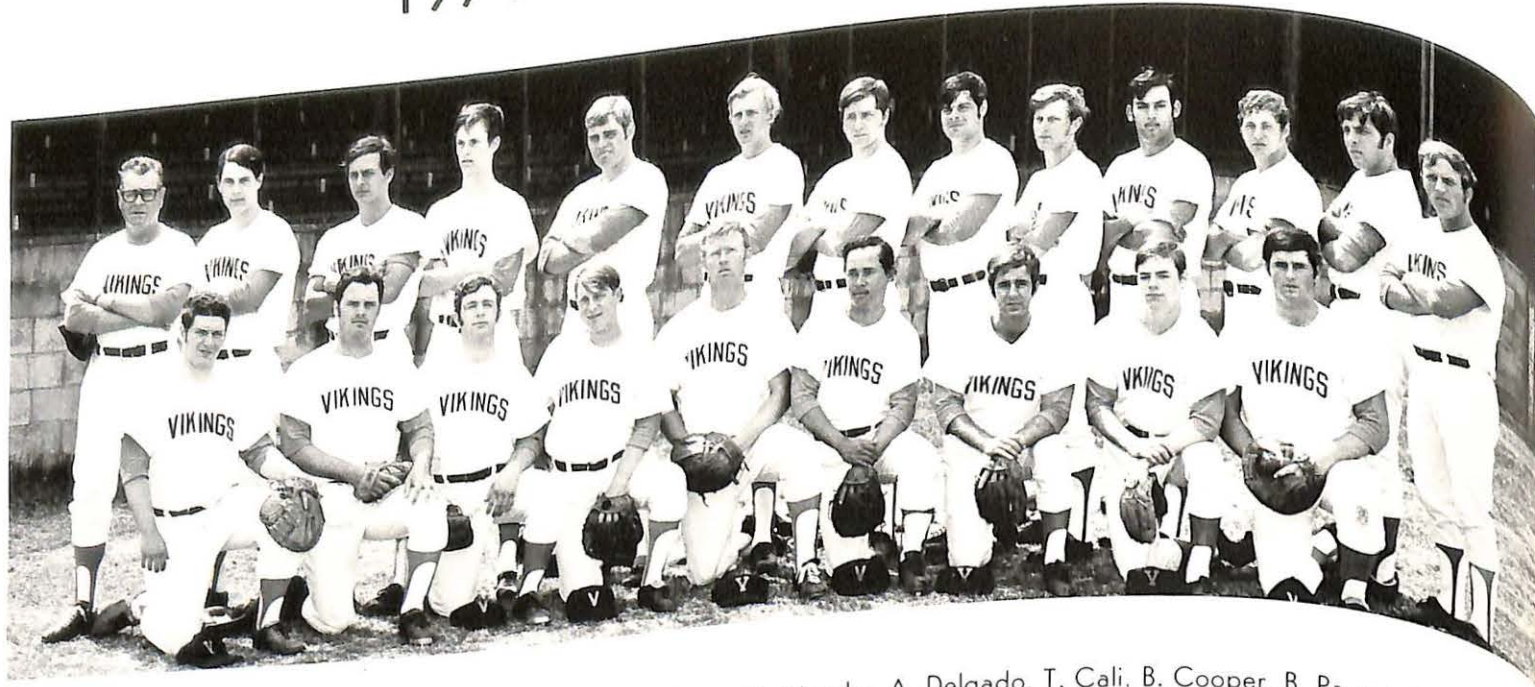

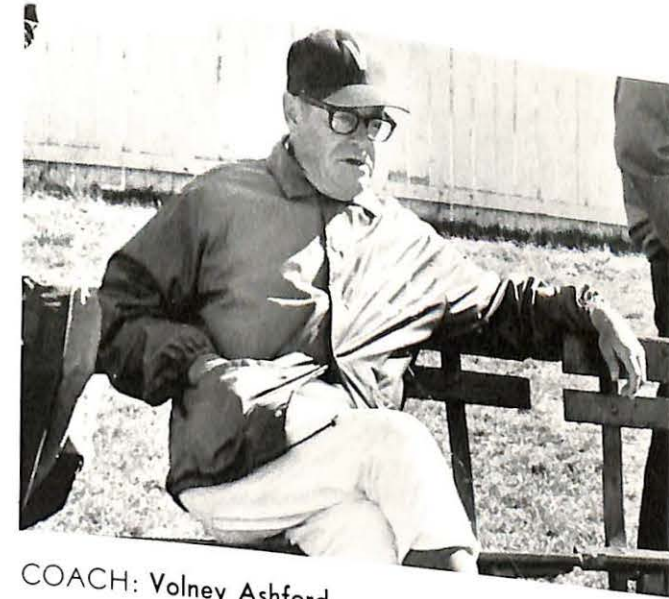

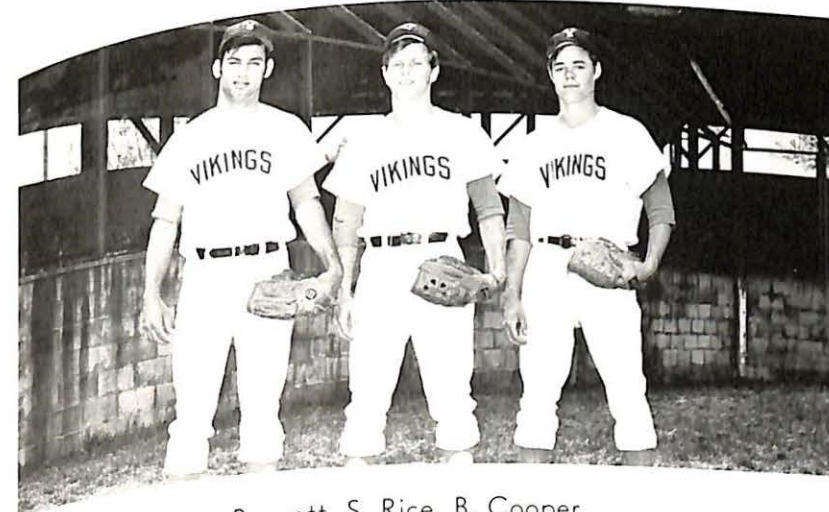
